THE KISS OF COURAGE

Since last August, we have all found ourselves living in a much more precarious world, where each morning's headline seems to expose some new problem or vulnerability. Fear has become a palpable emotion in our city, and many of us seek new sources of strength and inspiration. Marilyn Marshall, LPC, will speak on the "kiss of courage," exploring the archetype of the kiss and myths relating it to fear and to courage.

Marilyn Marshall is a licensed professional counselor in private practice in New Orleans and Baton Rouge and a candidate in training with the Inter-Regional Society of Jungian Analysts through the New Orleans Seminar. She has previously discussed the archetype of the kiss, most recently in the article "A Close-Up of the Kiss," which appeared in the spring, 2005, issue of *Spring Journal*. Marilyn lost her Lakeview home in the storm.

TOWARDS THE ARCHETYPE OF THE WOMAN HEALER

Through lecture, slide presentation and discussion, we will explore the archetype of the woman healer as exhibited in Conjure Woman of the African American tradition (as portrayed in Romare Bearden's fabulous collages); Sanapia (an eagle medicine woman of the Comanche tradition); Phemba (a figure from the Congo); and Ms. Ella (a traiteuse of the Cajun tradition). These woman healers come to their practices trained in their respective traditions and seasoned by life. They also think of themselves as conduits for a greater healing power. We will explore commonalities that contribute to an understanding of the archetype of the woman healer and look at how this archetype can manifest in our daily lives and consulting rooms.

Jutta von Buchholtz is a Swiss Diplomat Jungian analyst who works with clients in Birmingham, Alabama as well as in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. She is also involved in the training of Jungian analysts both at the New Orleans Training Seminar as well as the Jung Institute in Zurich, Switzerland. Jutta is an LPC but in a "former life" earned her Ph.D. in medieval literature from Vanderbilt University. She presents lectures and workshops on topics related to the psychology of Carl Jung both in the United States and Europe and is touched and intrigued to observe psyche's way in everyday life.

HEALING FROM KATRINA: THE ROLE OF THE COMMUNITY

In recent months we've learned both what it is to lose our community and how deep and compelling our connection with the lives of others truly is. The experience of loss often elicited a powerful bond between complete strangers, a sudden recognition of how tightly interwoven the fabric of community can be. Understanding this aspect of our relationship to the Other is an important part of the individuation process. Karen Gibson, PhD, will speak about Jungian ideas about community and its role in our rebirth, including groups such as the Women of the Storm, outside organizations volunteering in rebuilding efforts, community efforts to take care of City Park, the Broadmoor effort, and other community bonds.

Karen Gibson, LCSW, PhD, a New Orleans native, is a Jungian analyst in private practice in New Orleans who does consultation and supervision as well as analysis. She is also interested in the application of analytical psychology to relationship therapy and the integration of object relations theory into Jungian analysis. Karen lost her Broadmoor home in the storm.
